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

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#### PREPARING A PLAY ABOUT PRINCESSES AND PEAS

Proceed with caution to ye local library. Peruse the shelves for copies of the prototype plot. Read plenty of interpretations. Start the first drafts of the script exploring a young girl named Princess who doesn't like her name or peas. Have her mother share stories about plenty of princesses, but have the protagonist turn the princesses into super heroes. You'll rapidly learn you don't know enough about the genre to script that play in the amount of time available no matter how much research you do. Nor do you wish to imply we shouldn't eat our vegetables. Reopen the original story. Rethink the predicaments of the people. There's a prince pursuing the perfect princess. What does that mean in contemporary society? Perhaps the prince is a single dad and his daughter, princess, pursues the perfect person for him. The princess stories surface as we meet each potential match — wait. Stop. With whom does your audience relate? The adults? No. Scrap that idea. Maybe Princess wants to find her prince. What if Prince is a puppy? Better yet, she wants to adopt a puppy from the pound. The adventures she and each potential puppy undergo are loosely based on folk tales, but it is the one who appears on her doorstep in the middle of the night that is the perfect fit. Hold it. Wait. Where do the peas come in? Please proceed back to the original story. What is it about? Sensitivity ... Compassion ... Kindness ... Feelings! It's about feelings! And being human! Making mistakes and struggling with everyday dilemmas which may or may not be blown out of proportion depending on how we feel about them. Sometimes we handle our feelings well, other times we hide them, or we don't share them appropriately. It's a play about people who have a lot of feelings, learning to deal with their feelings, while being honest, compassionate, and kind. The perfect play for today's world as we could always use more kindness and truthfulness in our lives. May this play provide you all the feelings.

Extend your production experience of *The Princess and the Peas* by taking the time to discuss the play and the experience of attending live theatre. Below are some questions and activities to guide your exploration.

#### **Sneaky Dancing**

The Princess and the Peas features a retelling of the lesser-known tale "The Twelve Dancing Princesses." In this story, twelve princesses secretly go to an underground palace in the middle of the night in order to dance with twelve princes that the girls' father has forbidden them to marry.

See if you and your family can dance different styles of dance influenced by various types of music. Turn the activity into a "Freeze Dance" contest. Choose one member of the family to be the "Suspicious King" to try and catch the dancers moving.

#### Create your own Fairy Tale

Fairy tales are a type of folklore that has been passed down for centuries from one generation to the next and have changed with each retelling. Create your own fairy tale using the outlined five-sentence story structure below. Have each member of your family share a story. Discuss the similarities and differences. Make it fun!

#### The Wild Swans by Hans Christian Anderson

A widowed king, with eleven sons and one daughter, marries a wicked queen. Out of spite, the queen turns the eleven boys into swans and tries to curse the daughter but cannot. Elisa must find a way to overcome the wicked queen.
